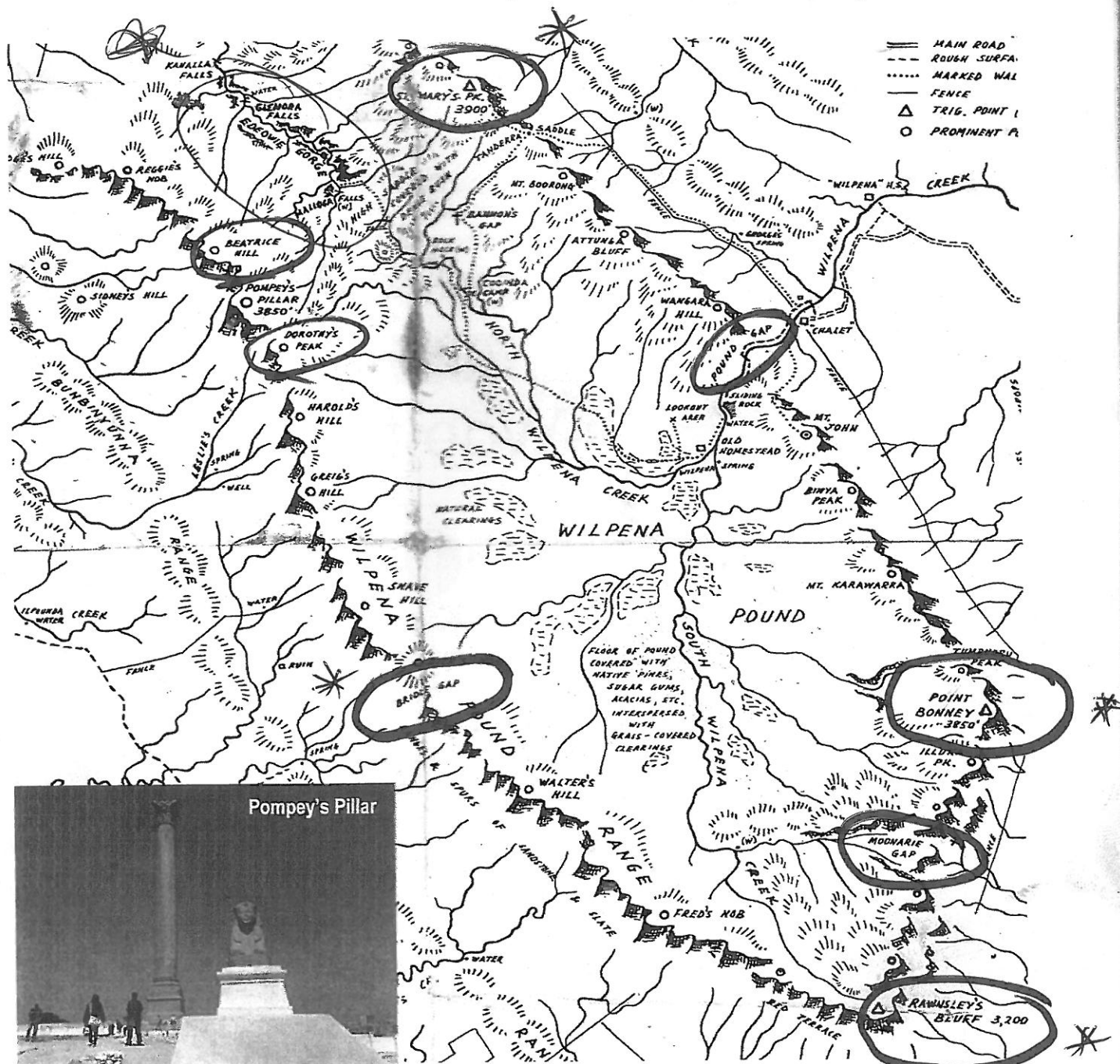


Local call spots

THIS IS PART of Jim's 1959 map revised in 1964, which was issued by the then SA Government Tourist Bureau. You can find all the names except Madge's Hill, which is partly cut off in the top left-hand corner.

You can see that this copy is battered from years of use hiking. Hence the folds. The dotted lines represent the Adelaide Bushwalkers' Circuit Trail.

The "Chalet" at the Pound entrance was built for Albert 'Binny' Bond's *Bonds Tours* in 1946. (Bus tours of the Flinders Ranges had begun in the mid-1930s, but stopped for the 2nd World War.) It could put up twelve of his passengers. Before it was built they'd stopped overnight in Hawker instead.

William Evans's Wilpena Names

- Madge's Hill (named after his daughter)
- Reggie's Nob (after his brother Reginald)
- Beatrice Hill (first name of daughter Madge)
- Pompey's Pillar —
- Dorothy's Peak (after daughter Dorothy)
- Harold's Nob (after son Harold)
- Greig's Hill (maiden name of his mother)
- Snave Hill (Evans's name backwards)
- Dick's Nob (after cadet surveyor Dick Crabb)
- Walter's Hill (after cadet surveyor Walter Rogers)
- Fred's Nob (Fred Orchard, brother-in-law).
